

How to Install your new Water Cooler

1. Remove all packaging and place your cooler in the desired location.
2. Establish your mains water source for connection.
3. Using the saddle valve provided, connect to your water source as follows:

Step 1; Remove the main body of the saddle valve. Unscrew both screws on the clamp, place in desired position and screw tightly in place



Step 2, Screw in the tap (as if shutting off water) and replace the main body by screwing it into the clamp (you will feel resistance as it cuts into the locking nut)



Step 3, once the tap has been screwed in as far as it goes, tighten up the locking nut.



Step 4, Screw the fitting to the saddle valve and then push fit the desired amount of flexi-pipe. If fitting a water block, insert between saddle valve and fitting.



Step 5; Unscrew the 2 screws at the bottom of the front panel and then remove the panel by pushing both sides firmly at the same time, the panel will simply "pop" off.



Step 6; Fix the bracket to the inside of the machine.
Note: for all desk top coolers fit the filter externally.



Step 7, Push the flexi-pipe through the hole in the back of the machine. Connect the flexi-pipe (which connects into the inlet fitting) into the top of the filter and turn on the water at the washing machine valve.



Step 8, Turn on the water and run water through the filter into a bucket. Run a full bucket through and then turn off the water.



Step 9, Connect the tank filler pipe into the other end of the filter and place in the bracket.





Step 10, Replace the front cover and position the machine where desired. Once in place, empty half a bucket through the dispenser taps, and turn on the power. NOTE: PLEASE ENSURE WATER IS PRESENT AT THE HOT TAP BEFORE SWITCHING ON THE POWER.

The cold water temperature and hot on/off switch can be found in the side panel.

Your cooler is now ready to use.
